Pharmacologic Management in Critical Care and Emergency Medicine



Course Description

This course is designed to broaden and deepen the critical care and/or emergency medicine nurse's knowledge and application of pharmacologic treatment principles. This course is designed to build a strong foundation of critical understanding of pharmacokinetic basics that can be applied to all drugs. The course will then explore common conditions found in critical patient populations with an emphasis on pharmacologic management.
