Breast Milk and Lactation

Course Description

This course will enable the bedside clinician to care for the lactating mother and breastfeeding infant on basic and advanced levels. Breast milk value, supporting the mother with basic lactation care and assisting the infant with breastfeeding practice will be presented. Mothers with babies in the NICU require some different support. These topics include stimulating milk supply, partnering in care at the bedside and maintaining breast milk supply with planning for discharge.

- Integrate basic knowledge of breast milk when educating families.
- Identify the newborn or mother at risk of not being successful with lactation.
- Discuss the consequences to not providing breast milk for mother and infant.
- Relate differences for the breastfeeding mother with an infant in the NICU.
