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Inpatient Obstetric Nursing Exam Review

Presented in lecture format, this course reviews topics for the National Certification Corporation (NCC) Examination "Inpatient Obstetrics." The major components include disease processes during pregnancy, fetal evaluation, application of fetal monitoring for the laboring client, and postpartum and neonatal assessments.
